At Eastbrook School we recognise that as More Able, Gifted and Talented (MAGT) students you need access to a broad, balanced and challenging curriculum to enable you to reach your potential. Below are some suggested activities that will extend and enrich your learning and promote high attainment and progress. Should you complete any of the activities, let your teacher know, and show them your work.

Art (HOD: Mr Nathan - S.1.5)

Take a series of portrait photographs of a willing subject – this could be a family member or friend. Experiment with lighting; angles; colour; monochrome; costume; framing; background. Upload them to your OneDrive (your teacher can help you with this) and print them out for your sketchbook. These will be your primary sources for portraiture personal development. Use these photographs to create new artwork such as: a set of paintings and drawings; a collage of your photographs; a mixed media collage with drawings, paintings and photography, as well as any other materials; a 3D work in the style of Brno Del Zou. Also, research Brno Del Zou! You can also use Photoshop or any other editing software or app to edit these into new images, using layering and collaging techniques. For any other advice or ideas, just see your art teacher.

Business

- Research arguably the world's greatest entrepreneur, Bill Gates. Watch the documentary on Netflix Inside Bill's Brain: Decoding Bill Gates. Then Read his business biography: https://www.biography.com/businessfigure/bill-gates
- Consider what makes him so successful. Do you believe that he is the world's greatest entrepreneur? Who challenges him for this title?

Design and Technology (HOD: Mr Mugombe – SG.25)

- Ettore Sottsass was an influential Italian designer who famously re-designed the home typewriter and made it into desirable product when he worked for Olivetti, arguably an historical equivalent of Apple! Watch how Ettore became interested in design and why he formed the Memphis design movement of successful international designers. Watch the short film and then research how Ettore was involved in Alessi.

Drama (HOD: Mrs Bishop-S.1.28)

Visit the National Theatre London, go to the book shop within the theatre and find a book that focusses on 'monologues. Find a monologue that suits your interest and then evaluate what the characters' objective is during this monologue as well as consider the given circumstances that the character must be in?

English (HOD: Ms Pearson B.G.3)

- Watch a film version of Macbeth or An Inspector Calls and write a review, linking it to your own understanding of the text
- Quotation challenge: learn fifteen quotations form each exam text you have studied and make a flash card for each quotation with notes about meaning
- Read a novel and record a podcast reviewing it

Geography (HOD: Mr Ameen-E.2.1)

Finally, read The Cold War by John Lewis Gaddis and create a timeline that outlines the major causes, crises and consequences of the Cold War.

Science (HOD: Mr Ibrar –S.2.13)

• Our world is full of patterns. If you pour milk into your tea and give it a stir, you'll see a swirl, a spiral of two fluids, before the two liquids mix completely. The same pattern is found elsewhere. In 'Storm in a Teacup: The Science of Everyday Life' by Helen Czerski, the little things are explained using physics. Each chapter begins with something small and familiar, like popcorn, coffee stains or refrigerator magnets and uses it to explain some of the most important science and technology of our time.
